1	<b>Friday – Prayer Line</b> We pray for S, who wakes each day at 3:30am and struggles to sleep again. He asks that prison would change him for the better. Lord, bring him rest and renewal.	9	<b><u>Saturday – Bible Studies</u></b> In Hebrews 11:1–6, we reflect on faith — the assurance of things hoped for. We pray that this faith would grow in even the darkest corners of our prisons.
2	<b><u>Saturday – Bible Studies</u></b> Colossians 3:1–4 invites us to 'set our minds on things above.' We pray for those in prison to find peace in Christ and to hold on to the hope of new life in Him.	10	<b>Sunday – Chapels and Chaplaincy Teams</b> We pray that today's chapel services would be filled with truth, light and hope. May those who attend feel God's presence and receive His peace.
3	<b>Sunday – Chapels and Chaplaincy Teams</b> We pray that worship in prison chapels today would bring deep joy and comfort. May chaplains and volunteers be filled with wisdom and strength.	11	<b>Monday – Pastoral Care training</b> We pray for all those undertaking the PC1 training this week. We pray that it would be a really useful, fruitful, strengthening time for all involved.
4	<b>Monday – Prayer Line</b> We remember R who asks for prayer to walk in God's ways. He gives thanks for life and safety and asks for prayer for all people. Lord, bless his heart of gratitude.	12	<b>Tuesday – Letter Link</b> We thank God for Letter Link volunteers and participants. May every letter sent this week encourage, uplift and remind people in prison that they are not forgotten.
5	<b>Tuesday – Prayer Line</b> We lift up B who prays for his sister A and for his brother L — that L would find happiness and love despite struggles. We pray for the family members of all people in prison today.	13	<b>Wednesday – Prayer Line</b> We remember S who asks for prayer for his trial which has been delayed many times. He longs to see his children. Lord, bring justice, strength and comfort to him and his family.
6	<b>Wednesday</b> We pray for those working on shaping a new programme to build on the legacy of Sycamore Tree. Please ask for God's wisdom, creativity and clarity as we seek to develop an approach that will continue to bring healing, understanding and transformation to people in prison.	14	<b>Thursday – PF Groups</b> We bring PF Rochdale and PF Rochester before God. May their witness be strong, their teams be united and their service be rooted in love.
7	<b>Thursday – PF Groups</b> We give thanks for PF Preston and PF Risley. May their volunteers be encouraged as they bring God's light and compassion into prisons.	15	<b>Friday – Prayer Line</b> We pray for J who is due for release in two weeks. He asks for the Holy Spirit to continue changing him. He needs a GP and medication support. Lord, please provide what he needs for a safe, stable transition.
8	<b>Friday – Prayer Line</b> We lift up A who asks for prayer for himself and a friend. He is so grateful for our prayers. Lord, bless them both and let them know they are not alone.	16	<b><u>Saturday – Bible Studies</u></b> As we study Hebrews 12:1–3, we pray for those who feel weary. May they fix their eyes on Jesus and find the strength to persevere.
		17	<b>Sunday – Chapels and Chaplaincy Teams</b> We lift up all prison chaplains and chapel teams. May they be refreshed in their calling and equipped to lead with compassion.

18	<b>Monday – Prayer Line</b> We pray for P who asks for God’s protection and provision in a prison where the dangers of spice are present. He prays for his mother, his late father, his sister and even two racehorses. Lord, honour his prayers and surround him with safety.	25	<b>Monday – Prayer Line</b> We pray for L who asks that when he’s released, he won’t return to prison. ‘I can’t be living like this anymore,’ he says. Lord, give him strength, support and a new path.
19	<b>Tuesday – Prayer Line</b> We pray for D who asks that God will look after his sons and give them a future brighter than his. May every parent in prison feel supported as they pray for their children.	26	<b>Tuesday – Prayer Line</b> We pray for R who longs to return home and care for his grandmother. May their reunion come soon, and may their time together be full of love and renewal.
20	<b>Wednesday – Prayer Line</b> We pray for B who feels abandoned by God. He says his prayers are going unanswered and that he is struggling to hold on. Lord, show him that you are near — even in the silence.	27	<b>Wednesday – Prayer Line</b> We pray for L, who gives thanks for Prison Fellowship. ‘You are a light in the darkness,’ he says. Lord, continue to use this ministry to bring healing.
21	<b>Thursday – PF Groups</b> We thank God for PF Rotherham and PF Rugby. May their local partnerships grow strong and their work be filled with grace and truth.	28	<b>Thursday – PF Groups</b> We bring PF Saltash and PF Sandbach before God. May their faithfulness be richly blessed and their service continue to bring hope to those they support.
22	<b>Friday</b> As we go into the bank holiday weekend, we hold in prayer all those who are missing family. We also pray for those working in prison when staffing levels are low.	29	<b>Friday – Prayer Line</b> We lift up J who asks for prayer for D who recently died in his prison. Lord Jesus, comfort all who are grieving, and be present in the pain.
23	<b>Saturday – Bible Studies</b> Hebrews 12:22–29 paints a picture of God’s unshakable Kingdom. We pray that people in prison will know this eternal foundation and stand firm in His grace.	30	<b>Saturday – Bible Studies</b> As we end the month in Hebrews 13:15–21, we pray that people in prison would be strengthened in every good thing, to do God’s will — and know they are not alone.
24	<b>Sunday – Chapels and Chaplaincy Teams</b> We pray for all those leading and attending chapel today. May the Word go out with power and comfort all who hear it.	31	<b>Sunday</b> We give thanks for every chaplain who has faithfully served through this month. As August comes to a close, we pray they would find rest, renewal and fresh vision for the season ahead. May God continue to use them to bring light into dark places.
